- Downtown Seguin is now over 185 years old which means there are areas with aging and underperforming infrastructure.
- The City of Seguin in the process of infrastructure and sidewalk improvements in the 100 block of West Gonzales, 200 block of East Court, and the 100 block of South Camp.
- One of the ultimate goals for Main Street is creating a pedestrian friendly environment and Main Street has been successful with grant funding through the Texas Capital Fund to construct thousands of linear feet of sidewalks in downtown.
